

A Tribute to Peter C. Morley, Ph.D., Professor



Professor Peter Morley is retiring from the University of Minnesota, College of Pharmacy as of June 30, 2007. Dr. Morley has been with the College of Pharmacy since 1990.

Professor Morley is quite different from most faculty members you will find in Colleges of Pharmacy today. First, he is a medical anthropologist, and, by virtue of his education and research, he has a unique understanding of patients' drug taking behaviors. Second, he has had experience teaching medical students at Memorial University Medical School of Newfoundland, nursing students at the University of Utah School of Nursing, and pharmacy students at the University of Florida and presently at the University of Minnesota. This broad range of experiences allows him to bring interesting perspectives to the College of Pharmacy. After growing up in England, he studied politics, sociology, anthropology, and political science at Simon Fraser University in British Columbia, Canada. Professor Morley continued his education at Stirling University in Scotland where he conducted doctoral work in anthropology.

Professor Morley has advised graduate students from a diverse set of disciplines in the health and social sciences. He has been elected a fellow of the Royal Anthropological Institute of Great Britain and a fellow of the Society for Applied Anthropology of the United States.

Thank you Dr. Morley for your valuable contributions to the Social and Administrative Pharmacy Program and your contributions to the Pharmaceutical Care & Health Systems Department.

#### Albert I. Wertheimer Leadership Fellowship in Social and Administrative Pharmacy

This fellowship was created to provide an annual award for a graduate student in the Social and Administrative Pharmacy Program at the University of Minnesota. The graduate student is chosen annually based on demonstration of a desire to pursue a leadership role in pharmacy – as has been the trademark of the many graduates who studied under Dr. Wertheimer. The student must (1) have demonstrated leadership while enrolled in the SAPH Graduate Program, (2) have adequate progress toward completion of the Ph.D. degree, (3) be currently enrolled, (4) have completed Ph.D. preliminary exams, (5) served as a teaching assistant during one or more semesters, and (6) write an essay on how they plan to encourage *Leadership in Pharmacy* upon graduation.

This fellowship was awarded to Sarah Shoemaker in 2003, Reshmi Singh in 2004, Joel Farley in 2005 and Christine Bartels in 2006 at the level of \$3,000 each.

Our goal is to increase the funding for this fellowship and any contribution amount would be welcomed.
